For the past several years we have been constantly making efforts on integration of livelihood and community conservation around protected forest areas. We are successfully working around Kanha Tiger Reserve on sustainable livelihood and conservation issues.

Being a grass root implementing organization, we work on issues that impacts on all human being i.e. sustainability of natural resources and wild animals.

CDC is continue working on issue of Malnutrition among 0-5 age group children's and different health issues of women and adolescent girls. Projects on Malnutrition has been initiated a process of community awareness, adaptation of healthy practices and child care. After several efforts of the govt. and non government organization's, the issue of health rights is still in cross road. TB, Malaria and Women's health's needs more action to ensure availability of health services to all. Finally, it is a nice feeling to see that our efforts on the ground in creating sustainable livelihoods for rural poor, tribes have been making tremendous impact in changing lives. Hundred and thousands of families are living a dignified life today because of our decision to work with them. This is the single fact that motivates us to do more. My heartiest congratulations to my colleagues who have been part of this journey.


Conservation & Livelihood

CDC is working on conservation and sustainable livelihood since last 6 years, we have successfully implemented projects with WWF—DST, around Kanha Tiger Reserve. In continuation of the project in the last three years we worked with Rufford Small Grant Foundation of Promotion of Community Conservation. Through this project over three years we have worked in more than 30 villages which is situated around tiger reserve.

This year we worked directly with 400 families to enhance their livelihood through land based activities. The project has been supported these families to grow vegetables for their supplementary livelihood. Through the project support 85% families are able to get more up to double their annual income through vegetable cultivation. The changes coming among the community towards forest and wildlife. The peoples intervention in the forest has been reduced without any force. We trained community on sustainable harvesting of forest product and need of these natural resources to make this world sustainable. Our success on to reduce consumption of fire wood through promotion of improved wood stove and bio-globules. Through the project we trained farmers on making of compost manure and its use. Tried to move towards use of renewable energy and we provides solar lamps to the poorest families. We are now the situation to scale up the project area and reach to more families. This year we worked with school going children's and youths to educate them on wildlife conservation and environmental issues. Trained Eco Development Committee for managing the local resources and making them sustainable. CDC becomes more resourceful organization towards experience of planning and implement projects around protected forest areas.









Community Based Management of Malnutrition




As we all know that the nutritional status of children is very poor, its accepted by the Govt. that every 5th child of the state is malnourished and there is high percentage of Severely malnourished children. Child death due to malnutrition is occurring in the state. Most of district falls in the bad situation of malnutrition.

With the support of CRY and Vikas Samvad we have initiated a project in Baihar block of Balaghat district. We are covering 19 Anganwadi centres of 6 villages and trying to develop a model of community based management of malnutrition. Through the project we work directly with community and supporting ICDS to improve their reach and services.

Through the project we are working with 749 children's 0-5 age group, our project staffs taking weight and height of all children's enrolled in the Anganwadi centre.

Our Approach for Community Based Management







Setting up a Comprehensive Model of Prevention and Management of Malnutrition

Community Based Management of Malnutrition is the same intervention in another block of the Balaghat district. This project is being supported by Sir Dorabji Tata Trust. Through the project we are covering 100 villages of Birsa Block.

Purpose of the project: Conducting Baseline line Survey

The present small grant was planned for conducting baseline survey before setting up a Comprehensive Model of Prevention and Community Based Management of Malnutrition in three blocks of Madhya Pradesh. CDC is part of this intervention and implementing this project in Balaghat district. The Birsa block of Balaghat district has been identified for this project. There was few specific objectives of this period.

- Conduct Baseline survey of targeted 100 villages
- Environment creation with local community for malnutrition intervention
- Village Profiling
- Team building for project.

Future plan for the intervention

- Home visits and community meeting with feeding demonstration.
- Nukkad shows to fine tune the team members and trained more team members
- Meeting with ICDS at Sector and Block level
- Project team is trained and need to continue to retain the staff.
- WCD is interested to know what you are going to do from Jan. onwards, they are planning to make a joint action plan with us.
- Panchayat and other community level institutions interested to support the project, there is need to continue dialogue with them.

The project staffs working in very remote and tribal area were there no transportation and communication. We are trying to reach each and every child through home visit. We focus on home visit and feeding demonstration to the family members. There is very much poor situation of knowledge and practices of health behavior.



AXAYA INDIA TB PROJECT

CDC is working on Tuberculosis since last five years, The organization starts working with CHAI [Catholic Health Association of India] on Axaya India project in 2010-II. Since than organization has been worked very effectively on the project. GKS [means community meeting], sputum collection and transportation, Akshay Samvad and mid media activities etc. During the last year we have done 43 GKS, through the GKS we reached 798 people directly with proper information and knowledge of TB. There is PRI representatives, VHSC members, SHG members, Youths and farmers who attended the community meeting. and we reached more than 4000 household through Akshya Samvad with information of TB.

Balaghat is one of the most vulnerable district for TB, positivity is high in rural tribal area but health services and reach of the services is very poor. Last year we have collected around I300 sputum collection through community volunteer and there is more than I0 % positivity on collected sputum. We have done lots of advocacy at the district and block level for TB patients treatment and other issues through TB Forum.





UTKARSH VIDHYALAYA

CDC is working on Primary Education since its origin, the approach of the working on education is both formal education and non formal education. We are continue doing advocacy to provide good primary education to children's. To set up some model for easy learning organization runs a school called UT-KARSH VIDHYALAYA. The school is situated at a very small village called GARHI, which is remote and tribal area. Through the school we gives value based education to the children's and easy learning techniques. We promote children's to do and learn. It's a not only formal education but we gives health education also. We run fortnightly school health education classes for all children's. School is using various games and tools to teach students in very good environment. This year we completed our school building with the support of donation of members and some loan from friends and well-wishers. Organization is committed to provide good environment and facilities to the children's for their overall development. We have started computer education at the school for all students. This year there was a big event for children which called BAL MAHOTSAVA. This program was fully managed by school children's. This was a platform for students to perform their talent and ability. At this stage there is around 200 children's enrolled for class KG to Class 8th.







Other Program, Event, Visits

Internshif tofd Bts

CDC has been provided an opportunity to 6 MBS students from SP Jain Institute, Mumbai for 6 week internship at the organization project. The 6 students has been spent 6 week and worked with project staff during April-May. The internship was based on our Community Based Management of Malnutrition project. All the students stayed at Garhi and learnt, how organization working in the field of malnutrition. We are thankful to SPJIMR Mumbai for sending the students at our organization.

Internship tof dABUS

This year 39 MSW students from Rajeev Gandhi MSW college, Gondia has been visited organization, we organized one day training for all students on how voluntary organization works. We discussed on vision, mission, objectives and overall procedure to run an organization. CDC believe to give proper and full guidance to youth and linking them to this sector. We are thankful to college for this opportunity.

AYV project

As organization is working on Adobe Youth Voices project since last three years, with TIG [Taking IT Global], the project is for youths of 13–18 age group, through the project we train youths on making of media pieces and how to use photo shop and premier software to express themselves, what they want and how wish to see the world. Through the training we gives full opportunity to youths to see the problems and bring the problem to the community to solve the problems. This year we trained 86 youths from two schools, who prepared more than 10 projects on various social issues, an exhibition also done by the organization.

New Initiatives

Organization has got an opportunity to work with PHF [Paul Hamlyn Foundation]. The project has been approved for Promotion of Sustainable Livelihood of Tribes around Protected Forest area. The project will work intensively with 300 families by next two years. The project will starts by month of April 2014.

ECCE Policy Advocacy

CDC has joined NACDIP the network of national level which is working on effective implementation of ECCE –MTMLE policy. The organization coordinating this campaign for Madhya Pradesh State, we organize a state level consultation at Jabalpur for more than 30 local organization who are working on tribal areas.
